



15 Give my greetings to the brothers and sisters at Laodicea, and to Nympha and the church in her house. 16 After this letter has been read to you, see that it is also read in the church of the Laodiceans and that you in turn read the letter from Laodicea. Colossians 4:15-16 (NIV)

Staffing update: the Elders have decided to spend the next several months in "discernment", seeking the Lord regarding what position, what ministry-focus God will be leading us to fill with our next Associate Pastor. So, we'll wait to call a Pastor Nominating Committee, until we have a clearer sense of direction. So, these next months are going to provide an opportunity for some of you to step into greater service.

The future is also part of the FAPC story. Where is the Lord taking us? What is our specific and unique calling as a church in 2019 and beyond? You are a key part of our discerning process in following God's guidance. So ...

Here are three questions we need you to answer:

- 1) What is it about FAPC that most energizes you?**
- 2) What are the unique needs and opportunities both in FAPC, the local community and the Armenian community at-large?**
- 3) What are the resources and capabilities that God has brought together in us as FAPC?**

At the Session's direction, our *God Dreams* Team continues to work on understanding our unique calling as a church and in the next several weeks you have the opportunity to express your perspective on these three and a few other related questions.

Beginning in the July 28 worship service, we will be taking time to canvas your thoughts and feelings. It's going to be a very different Sunday! Other opportunities for providing your input will be available via email, an electronic survey, and a second "face-to-face" time on Sunday, August 4. Anonymous and "identified" responses are welcome! After receiving all the responses, we'll compile and collate them and share the results with you in September.

Our *God Dreams* Team has spent more than thirty hours together seeking the Lord and listening well to each other, and now with your contribution, I believe we will have greater clarity as we identify our mission and vision as a disciple-making church both now and in the years to come!

This is an exciting time in the FAPC story! Mark your calendars! Be sure to participate!



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY NEWS



1 Corinthians 12:27 says, *"Now you are a part of the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it."*

When I am sitting by myself in my house, it is hard for me to know what part I play in the body of Christ, but when I am serving with other parts of the body, it is very easy to begin to identify where we all fit. This has never been truer for me than it has been during the week of VBS. Our theme was "In the Wild," and it took a variety of very talented, very willing people to pull this week off.

We had four different groups of children traveling through the CE building having various encounters with Jesus (plus one tiny group of babies in the nursery).



Each morning began with an energetic worship rally where kids sang songs, learned about and gave to Young Life Armenia (almost \$500!), and were primed for their time in Bible Study. Each day the children studied a different event in the life of Jesus. They worked

toward understanding that Jesus is the Son of God and that He knew His purpose was to be our Messiah.



After Bible Study, the groups moved through rotations of games snacks and crafts. In each rotation, the leaders emphasized the main truth of the Bible story. Whether it was making a wildlife diorama or zebra puppet in crafts, playing water games or getting messy with shaving cream, or eating cookies made to look like sandals—the focus was always on Jesus.

The final day of the week ended with an interactive presentation with Reptile Ron and his animal friends. Kids (and adults!) were able to interact with a stick bug, a king snake, a pancake turtle, and a large lizard. The highlight of the presentation was the six foot long yellow boa constrictor. Kids had a chance to pet the large snake and a handful of adults volunteered to "wear" the snake. Everyone enjoyed seeing that big snake draped across the shoulders of their friends.

(Psalm 66: 1-7) and an English Language Message entitled "Only Thing that Matters!" (Philippians 3: 7-14). Garo Cardoux shared his faith journey and testimony reflecting the impact of Badveli Mgo's ministry on his life.

At the conclusion of the Service, worshippers gathered in the Fellowship Hall for a luncheon to honor the Mekredijian Family. The Hall was decorated with family and scenic photographs taken by Badveli Mgo and each banquet table included a beautiful floral arrangement with a picture of the honorees with various FAPC members. Elaine thanked Badveli Mgo for ministering across the generations and for watching out for her daughter Joy on a Young Life Armenia missions trip. She added, "I admire you two – Tamar and Mgo – because you are letting God design your next steps. We love you!"



Julie Tikijian Bogosian thanked Tamar of behalf of the young mothers of the Mommy & Me ministry. Julie said no words could adequately describe the impact of Tamar on the four-year Friday morning ministry. Julie said Tamar led by example, was always helpful, and was willing to share in the joys and struggles of young mothers with an open heart and encouraging spirit.

Elder Sevag Afarian spoke on behalf of the members of the Young Couples' Bible Study group. Passion for Jesus. Genuinely loves people. Not afraid to show it." Badveli Greg presented Badveli Mgo a token of esteem on behalf of the Session and Congregation and referred to the honoree as one who "taught well, preached well, and loved well." Badveli Greg thanked Badveli Mgo for experiencing the love of Jesus Christ and then sharing that love with all of us at FAPC.



Badveli Mgo responded to the tribute by thanking all the speakers, saluting his spiritual mentor, the late Reverend Ara Jizmejian, and expressing gratitude to the congregation for "the deep way you have embraced us and loved us." He extended heartfelt thanks to the volunteers in various FAPC ministries, fellow staff members past and present, and his senior colleagues, Senior Pastor Mgrdich Melkonian, Interim Senior Pastor Paul Irwin, and Senior Pastor Gregory Haroutunian. Badveli Mgo concluded his remarks by saying, *"We don't know what's next or where. Please pray for clarity and discernment."* The day concluded with Dr. Chris Shamlian offering just such a prayer on behalf of Badveli Mgo, Tamar, and their family.
