Who are You?

When we meet strangers or are introduced to someone for the first time, we share our names. Sometimes we share our spouse's name or our children's names and ages, too, and usually where we live and what we do. Our name, our location and our work = who we are.

Not exactly.

While my name is important and where I live gives context for life here in the Valley, my work, my residence and my name don't define me, and yours don't define you. The information definitely can help us understand and get to know each other.

However, you are more than these. If you are a follower of Jesus Christ, you are a beloved child of God. Please reread that. Don't skim over that sentence! The Father has "lavished" His love upon His children! The Apostle Paul says in Romans 5:5 that God has poured out His love into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Wherever we go we can experience the love of God by His Holy Spirit!

Who are you? In Christ, you are a beloved child of God! You're also "in process," incomplete. God is not finished with you yet. The Apostle John tells us that in the present—right now—we are children of God, and the best is yet to come! He is molding and shaping us to become more and more like Jesus. We make every effort to purge ourselves from sin, unworthy appetites and unholy habits. We weed out the love of this world and its passions. We remove the rocks of people-pleasing and performance living so the roots of the Gospel seed in our lives can grow and bear fruit. We are a work-in-progress!

We will be like Jesus! This is our hope! We will see Him face to face and upon His return we will be fully transformed to be just like Him! We are becoming who we already are. Am I perfectly like Christ? Are you? Of course not! However, if we anchor our lives in our identity in Christ, as beloved children of God, we have hope as we face daily challenges and temptations. He is our hope!

It's a lie to believe that our value is dependent on our performance. When I believe this lie, I slip off the solid and safe platform of my identity in Christ, and end up in shame, hiding, rationalizing and trying to be good enough.

It's a lie to believe that our value is dependent upon whether certain people love or like us. Of course, we want others to like us, but when that's what we spend all our energy on, we end up buried in anxiety and resentment. In Christ, God loves us just as we are, not as we should be.

Finally, it's a lie to believe that our value is dependent on whether we are in control and producing the results and the outcomes we are pursuing. When we try so hard to be in control, we are actually being controlled by fear and anger. People become a means to an end, our end! We lose our balance and lose our identity.

Who are you? In Christ you are a beloved child of God. Apart from Him, you're trapped in a lie. Use this time of Lent to invite the Holy Spirit to search your heart and anchor your identity in Jesus.

Barbara Hansen, renowned California food writer, passed away at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles on January 28 at the age of 90. A native of Hollywood and lifelong resident of Hancock Park, Barbara was educated at Stanford University and UCLA, began a journalistic career at the Los Angeles Herald-Express, and later joined the Food Section of the Los Angeles Times. On January 14, 1998, Barbara published the photo essay "Leaves From Fresno," which introduced the FAPC Centennial Cookbook--"A Hundred Years and Still Cooking"--to millions of readers across California and throughout the United States. She received a James Beard Foundation Award for Newspaper Writing in 2004 and published such cookbooks as "California Cooking California Style," "Good Bread," "Mexican Cookery," "Taste of Southeast Asia," and the "Korean Restaurant Guide." She departed The Times in 2006 but continued to publish food-related articles in Southern California newspapers and two websites, "Table Conversation" and "EatMx." Barbara is survived by her nephew Eric Daniel Ball, his wife Jeanine, their sons Matthew and Justin, and many dear cousins.

Armenian rescue team welcome reception in Turkey.

The Armenian emergency team, came to Türkiye to provide support to search and rescue efforts following the Feb. 6 earthquakes in the southeast, welcomed the warm treatment they received in the country.

"They treated us very well. They always thanked us for coming and supporting and helping us," Garik Aghramanyan, the team leader, told a news conference in the Armenian capital Yerevan on Monday. The 28-member team, which arrived on Feb. 8, has returned home as rescue operations are coming to a close. "From the second we got off the plane, we only heard words of gratitude and thanks," he added.

Aghramanyan said his team rescued three people from the rubble in Adıyaman, one of the 11 provinces struck by the quakes that have caused widespread death and destruction.
