It's my favorite holiday! I love celebrating Thanksgiving! Throughout the Scripture we read repeatedly that the people of God are commanded to give thanks to the Lord because He is good and because His love endures forever!

God is worthy of praise and thanks because He is good, faithful, and merciful. He is unchanging, holy, and gracious. He is loving! So we obey eagerly and offer Him thanks and praise because He will never act toward us in any way except love. He always acts to accomplish His wise, good plans in our lives.

It doesn't feel like that all the time, does it?

That's why I was struck at a conference recently when the speaker said that his relationship with God is marked by three promises: 1) to be ever grateful; 2) to never take offense with God; and 3) to never be satisfied, always relentlessly pursuing God.

Ever grateful. Never offended.

Never satisfied.

Commitments like this are anchored in the love of God. Joyful, grateful prayer presumes an unchanging God of grace, mercy and goodness. The command to be thankful "for everything" demands a wise, all-knowing, omnipresent Lord who sovereignly rules over and in everything.

What struck me most about the three promises was the commitment to never be offended by God and by what He does. I'd never thought about taking offense at God. After all, He's God! Yet, the more I reflected about my own heart and replayed conversations I've had with literally hundreds of people, I realize that most every one of us has taken offense at something God has done.

We object to His timing. We're frustrated by His seeming silence and unresponsiveness. We take umbrage with the way He answers or doesn't answer our prayers. Even a glance at what matters to us reveals what appears to be a distinct lack of goodness, attentiveness and love. And, barring a prior commitment to rejoice, pray and give thanks, we grumble and take offense.

I'm seeking to adopt these three vows as a daily commitment to live deliberately in the love relationship the Lord wants with me. He wants the same for you! He wants us to live in the conscious awareness of His goodness, kindness and grace.

During this month of Thanksgiving, let's develop the intentional habit of giving thanks in all circumstances and even for all things. Let's submit by faith to gratitude to our good, sovereign, loving Lord. Happy Thanksgiving!





#### **Our Condolences**



Raymond Vahan Damadian, M.D., "Father of Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)" and FAPC Centennial Keynote Speaker, passed away at his home in Woodbury, New York on August 3, 2022 at the age of 86. A native of Manhattan, Dr. Damadian grew up in Queens, studied violin at the Juilliard School of Music, completed undergraduate work at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, and earned a graduate degree at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He built the first MRI scanner, nicknamed "Indomitable," and it produced the first MR image on July 3, 1977. He went on to found FONAR Corporation of Melville, New York and its subsidiary, Health Management Company of America. President Ronald Reagan awarded Dr. Damadian the National Medal of Technology in 1988 and Dr. Damadian was inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame a year later. On September 6, 1997, Dr. Damadian appeared before a capacity crowd in the Fresno Conference Center at M and Ventura Streets--site of Fresno's Historic Armenian Town--and movingly shared his faith and professional journey and the journey of the Armenian People as the culmination of the Centennial Celebration of FAPC. Dr. Damadian was preceded in death by his beloved wife, the former Elizabeth Donna Terry, who invited him to a Billy Graham Crusade at Madison Square Garden in 1957, where he responded to the altar call. He was also preceded in death by his parents, Vahan and Odette (Yazedjian) Damadian. He is survived by his three children, Keira Reinmund and her husband, Markus; Jevan Damadian and his wife, Victoria; Timothy Damadian and his wife, Helen; nine grandchildren; three great-grandchilren; and sister Claudette Chan.
