Living as a disciple of Jesus, committed to following Jesus, being changed by Jesus, and being on mission with Jesus is definitely in the "groan/grow-n zone" because moment by moment and decision by decision we are choosing His will over our own desires. What is incredible about our growth in Christ is that it is seen most obviously in our relationships with others. As we adopt more and more of Jesus' priorities and reflect more and more on His character in our relationships, it is unmistakable! "When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus." (Acts 4:13)

As we each grow in trust and in faithfulness to Jesus, the beauty of Jesus Christ will become more and more evident in our lives and in the life of our church. Lift up your eyes! The kingdom of God is expressing itself among us! Join us in the "grow-n zone" and express your love for Jesus in relationship with each other!

What is God revealing to you in this season of your life? I have long felt that we gain an increasing appreciation for God's love as we experience the love of others at different times of our lives. As children, we learn the love of our parents and family, but we also know they are teaching and correcting us as we grow. As we develop adult relationships we discover special people who love and accept us as we are, even knowing our faults and weaknesses, and that love is returned in kind. If we have children, we appreciate even more the love God has for us as his children. At this stage of life, retirement and lockdowns have led to decreased social interaction, and our children and grandchildren have settled out of the area. Yet we know and feel their love and the love of others (like you) just as we know God loves us. That love needs to be appreciated and not taken for granted. It needs to be shared.

What or who is the reason you are connected with being at FAPC? We had been attending First Presbyterian Church, but when a pastoral change occurred, I was interested in finding a smaller congregation such as the one I had grown up in. At the same time, we had three small children and I needed babysitting help. I decided to stop by the FAPC office, near our home, to ask about the worship services and perhaps get some babysitting leads as well. Anita Console encouraged me to come on Sunday morning, where I found a warm welcoming congregation under the leadership of Badveli and Knar Guekguezian. Also, Margaret Howsepian was a wonderful babysitter who even stopped by on Sunday mornings to take Sharon and Jimmy to Sunday School, giving me extra time with Michelle before we joined the others at church. While not Armenian, I shared your love of worship music, the enjoyment of Armenian food,...and a tendency to operate on "Armenian time."

What or who has had the greatest influence in your life? My family, of course, was the biggest influence in developing who I became as an individual. My husband Charley has had the greatest influence in my adult years because of the experiences he has brought into my life. He opened his medical practice in Fresno, where he was born and grew up, and so I moved away from my family in the Bay Area (and eventually joined FAPC). As we were then ready to start our family, I chose not to seek new employment but to become a full-time mother while also doing the office bookkeeping. I became the anchor point who kept daily life running while his career kept him busy for long hours. As a private pilot, he sometimes flew weekend missions to a medical clinic in Mexico run by Fresno's Flying Doctors of Mercy chapter. At one point we were raising emus in our basement and backyard. Particularly meaningful to me, though, has been our annual family summer vacation in the Lake Superior north woods, where his grandfather once ran a boys' camp. The remote location offers a closeness to nature, lakeside beauty, and many interesting experiences that over the years helped develop our close family unit.




