“¹ To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: These are the words of Him who holds the seven stars in His right hand and walks among the seven golden lampstands. ² I know your deeds, your hard work and your perseverance. I know that you cannot tolerate wicked people, that you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them false. ³ You have persevered and have endured hardships for my name, and have not grown weary.

⁴ Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first. ⁵ Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place. ⁶ But you have this in your favor: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. ⁷ Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.”

Revelation 2:1-7 (NIV2011)

First of all, “Thank you!” I am grateful for the opportunity to refocus my attention on being, first and foremost, a child of God, a disciple of Jesus so that I can return to Family Camp as a servant, a leader in the Body of Christ.

One of my favorite quotes that I still remember hearing first from my youth group leader in High School comes from Oswald Chambers—affectionately known as “Ozzie” in our family: We slander God by our willingness to serve Him without knowing Him. It comes from the October 3rd entry in his classic devotional, My Utmost for His Highest. The actual quotation is “We slander God by our very eagerness to work for Him without knowing Him.”

Close enough!

And slander Him I have! I believe each one of us who desires to serve the Lord, who desires to see His kingdom come, who yearns to see their life and the lives of others transformed and set free from the sin that so easily entangles us (Hebrews 12:1-2) are guilty of seeking to serve Him, to make an impact for Him, rather than focus our hearts on knowing Him.

How patient He is! He was patient with the disciples. Repeatedly He corrected them, rebuked them, and commanded them not to spread the word about Him because they would have gotten it wrong! Haven’t you been able to relate to the disciples as we’ve been reading and studying the Gospel of Mark? Even when Peter accurately identifies Jesus as God’s chosen Messiah, the Savior, within hours (maybe minutes!) Jesus addresses him as “Satan,” commanding him to take the rear, not the lead.

As I take these next several months to renew my soul, I’m eager to rekindle my “first love” for Jesus. You likely don’t know this, but in May of 2013 as I was seeking the Lord about submitting my candidacy for the position of Senior Pastor here at FAPC, I came to California to speak at a retreat at Camp AREV for UACC. I arrived a couple of days early to visit my parents. Since I woke up at 4 a.m., I took a drive into town with the goal of walking around the church facility to pray. Everything was gated up, so I just walked around from Raisina Street to the front of the church and back. I must have walked back and forth 20 times, simply praying, asking the Lord for guidance or a scripture.

One passage that the Holy Spirit kept bringing to mind was Revelation 2:1-7. I kept hearing verse 4 especially as I walked and prayed. “Yet I have this against you, that you have left your first love.” As I prayed a vision began to form that God might use me to rekindle FAPC’s “first love.” It’s only now, nearly ten years later, that I realize that this word was actually for me! Heavy sigh!

I am praying that this summer the Lord will meet each one of you as well and renew your love for Jesus. I hope you’ll participate in our FAPC Mission Statement Reflection Guide and luncheon on June 25th right after church. Spend this next month reflecting on our mission & vision statements and gather to talk about it together!

Can’t wait to see you all at Family Camp in August!

FAPC Missions Committee Update

The Missions Committee wants you to know that it is with pure joy that we serve our great God and the Body of Christ at FAPC. Missions and Evangelism are at the heart of the Great Commission.



The Pregnancy Care Center (PCC) is a life-saving ministry designed to show concern and compassion to young mothers through prayer, advocacy, and resources. They offer hope and encouragement for mothers to choose life for their unborn babies.

FAPC is currently participating in the Change for Babies campaign sponsored by the Pregnancy Care Center. This effort allows the Center to serve women experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. Services include pregnancy tests, limited ultrasounds, options education, resources and referrals, classes, post-abortive support groups, abstinence education and mentoring for males. Each month, the Fresno-based Center has nearly 500 client visits. As they state on their flier, choices for LIFE are being made.

How can you participate? There are empty baby bottles on a table in the narthex of our sanctuary. Please take a bottle and fill it with change, currency, or a check (tax donation receipt will be sent for checks written to Pregnancy Care Center). **Bring the bottle back to church by Father's Day (June 18).** You can either set it back on the table in the Narthex, or give it to Elaine Rubio or Paul Haroutunian.

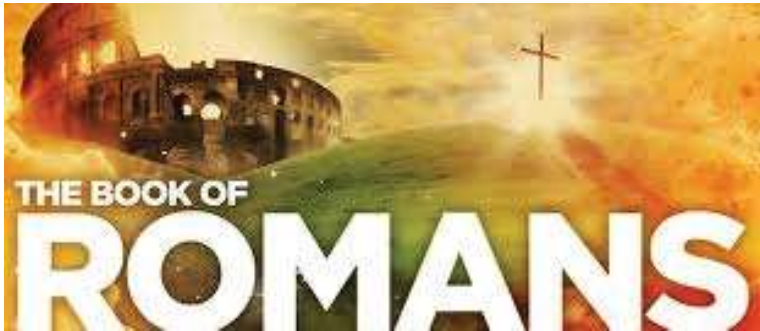

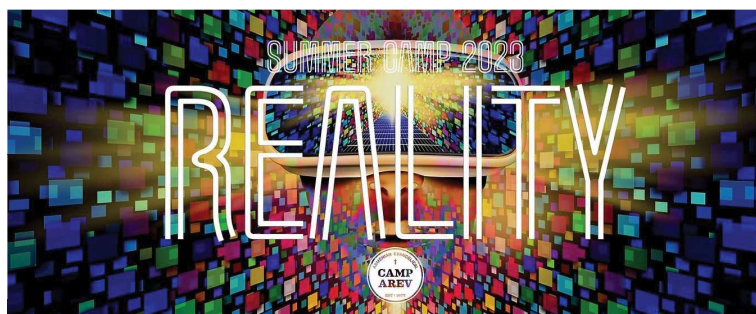


Men's Bible Study
