### Pastor's Message

"26 From one man He made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and He marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. <sup>27</sup> God did this so that they would seek Him and perhaps reach out for Him and find Him, though He is not far from any one of us."

Acts 17:26-27 (NIV2011)

Few times have I felt so disheartened than when I learned that Azerbaijan had attacked and taken Artsakh in less than twenty-four hours. The nations of the world turning a blind eye to the blockade for nine months was bad. But no outrage or objection from the United States or most other nations was devastating.

Once again, our people and the destiny of our people is of no consequence to the world. Talk of ethnic cleansing and genocide fell

on deaf ears. More than 100,000 people fleeing from their historic homeland hardly drew any attention at all.

But there is more to life—even geopolitical power grabs—than meets the eye. There is more to our grief than meets the eye. We believe that there is a God in heaven, and that there is a living God who hears the cries of His people. We believe that He is Sovereign over all—even war and politics. We believe that a day is coming when the Judge of all the earth will execute justice on our world.

I don't believe it was a coincidence that the morning Artsakh was taken, I was reading from the book of Revelation. I was struck repeatedly by the assurance that the risen Lord of all is returning and that He will vindicate His people. Throughout history, Christians have suffered unjustly because they were unwilling to assimilate into the cultures and societies of their times. Generation after

generation of those who follow Christ have been asked to trust Him at great personal cost.

We saw that in 1915 during the Armenian Genocide. We've seen it in the aftermath of the fall of the Soviet Union. Depending on where we live, the cost of remaining faithful to Jesus can be quite high. Revelation 12:11 described those who overcome the evil one, "They triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death."

The Lord assured the Church in Philadelphia in Asia Minor, "I will make those who are of the synagogue of Satan ... come and fall down at your feet and acknowledge that I have loved you. Since

you have kept My command to endure patiently, I will also keep you from the hour of trial that is going to come on the whole world to test the inhabitants of the earth." Revelation 3:9-10

He calls us to trust Him and to remain faithful. He rules history and will prove just, merciful and gracious when all is revealed. Acts 17 describes God's sovereignty over the nations and history. In His mercy, He has determined that Armenians will continue to exist.

Against all human explanation, we are still a nation, a people of whom many love and follow Jesus.

The same cannot be said of most ancient peoples. Imagine! He rules the times and boundaries of nations, kingdoms, empires and peoples. He does this with a singular purpose: that people will seek Him and find Him!

This is why we pray. This is why we gathered to pray on Wednesday, September 27. Pastors & believers from nearly ten other churches joined with us to pray and seek the Lord on behalf of Armenians & the Artsakhi refugees. We poured out our hearts. We lamented! We asked God to intervene. We pleaded with Him to meet our people and to bring Azeris & Turks to repentance.

Our God reigns! We may weep now but there will come a day when His victory is known! Until that time, we pray and ask to be a part of accomplishing His will here on earth.



## 'God hears prayers': Fresno Armenian church holds vigil for humanitarian crisis

FRESNO, Calif. (KSEE/KGPE) – Prayers and songs filled the halls of the First Armenian Presbyterian Church Wednesday night.

The community here, gathering to pray as the crisis in Armenia worsens. The church's pastor, Greg Haroutunian said they wanted to come together and talk to god.

### "We believe God hears prayer. That's the bottom line,"

"We believe God hears prayer. That's the bottom line," Haroutunian said. He said the current crisis stems from Azeri soldiers attacking the Armenian enclave of Artsakh in Azerbaijan. The attack is what's causing the current humanitarian crisis of refugees being forced to travel far distances under dangerous conditions.

"They're not going to be safe under an Azeri-ruled government. So, we're praying, number one for their safety, we're praying for the reality of their spiritual lives," he said.

Haroutunian says this comes after years of genocide and war for the Armenian people. In the church, they even have a stained-glass window, dedicated to remembering the victims of the 1915 Armenian genocide.

While there is a large population of Armenians in Fresno, the prayer vigil included people of all backgrounds.

Pastor B.T Lewis of the Rising Star Missionary Baptist Church came to the vigil. He says he has many meaningful people in his life who are Armenian.

"As they are deeply concerned about their homeland, I share that concern with them. Others in the city, other Christians, other pastors, other churches, other people in the city are standing in solidarity with them," Lewis said.

Haroutunian says there are about 120,000 residents who are fleeing from Artsakh.




## Harry Carl Halajian, beloved Ruling Elder of First Armenian Presbyterian Church, passed away on September 15, 2023 at the age of 93.

Harry's parents migrated from Kharpert to the Republic of Mexico following the Genocide and eventually settled in the United States. A native of San Diego, Harry grew up in Long Beach and Oakland, California, where he was Student Body President of Castlemont High School and a member of the varsity football and baseball teams.

After high school, Harry worked his way through the University of California at the Peter Paul Candy Manufacturing Company, makers of Almond Joy and Mounds Bars. He was a member of the Alpha Rho Mu Armenian Students Organization and served as President of the Armenian Christian Endeavor Union of California.

After earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration in January 1953, Harry served in the United States Army with the 43rd Infantry Division in Augsburg, Germany, Harry married Delores Garo in 1958 and they eventually settled in her hometown of Fresno. He began his career with Cal-Craft



Carpet, served as International Sales Representative for Berven of California, and continued his half-century career with a number of local flooring vendors.

At FAPC, Harry taught the Junior High School Sunday School Class, chaired the FAPC Barbecue Crew for Memorial Day Picnics and Merchants' Lunches, chaired the Session Committee on Missions, and was a regular member of the weekly Men's Bible Study Luncheon Group. In addition, he was a longtime Director of the Armenian Theological Students' Aid, Inc., a member of the Knights of Vartan Yeprad Lodge, Fresno West Camp of Gideons International, and helped organize the Oakland Chapter of the Triple X Fraternity.

In 1997, Harry chaired the committee that restored and reinstalled stained glass windows from the 1942 Sanctuary Building in the narthex of the new Fellowship Hall, in memory of the late Elder Paul Melikian. In recent years, he was an active participant in Bible Study Fellowship and the work of the Session Committee on Budget and Finance.

Harry was preceded in death by his parents, Barkev and Tourvanda (Kaprielian) Halajian, his sister, Madeline Arakelian, and his brothers-in-law, James E. Bagdasarian and Philip C. Garo, Sr. He is survived by his dear wife of 65 years, Delores; sons Barry and Paul and daughter-in-law Carolyn; daughter Melanie; grandsons Peter and his wife, Stephanie, and Mark and John; sister,

Armene Bagdasarian; brother-in-law John Arakelian; sister-in-law Elaine Garo; and many dear nieces, nephews, and cousins.
