Pastor's Message



"When people do not accept divine guidance, they run wild. But whoever obeys the law is joyful."

Proverbs 29:18 (NLT)

Merry Christmas!!! I'm looking forward to seeing all of you at church this Advent season and, especially, at the Children's Sunday School Christmas program on December 17th! It is going to be quite the event, so don't miss it!

Can you believe 2023 is ending and 2024 is right around the corner?! I know it seems cliché, but each passing year seems to accelerate. Just when I want to experience life more slowly and richly, I find myself hanging on for dear life!

How about you? Are you content with what you've accomplished this last year? Are you getting to the bottom of your "To Do List"? Are you looking forward to starting the New Year with resolutions, dreams, and goals? For me, December is filled with assessments, evaluations and forwardplanning. I love starting. On November 26, 2023, Mariné Frnzlyan concluded her eight-year tenure on the staff of First Armenian Presbyterian Church. Mariné served as Administrative Assistant in the FAPC Office from 2018 through 2021 and as Nursery Attendant and Sunday School Teacher to the toddlers of the Church Family from 2017 through her departure.

In May 2022, Mariné earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Communicative Disorders/Speech Language Pathology from California State University, Fresno. She has worked with The TALK Team, a Fresno-based pediatric speech therapy clinic since September and recently received her certification as a Speech-Language Pathology Assistant (SLPA).

In 2024, Mariné plans to continue her education and pursue a Master's degree and career as a Speech Language Pathologist. The Session and Congregation thank Mariné for her years of faithful service at FAPC and extend all good wishes in her future endeavors and pursuits.







Samaritan's Purse Evangelical Christian Organization Provides Aid to Armenians from Artsakh WATERTOWN — Samaritan's Purse, an evangelical Christian organization that both provides physical aid and promotes the Gospel, has recently provided aid to the forcibly displaced Armenians from Artsakh in Armenia. Two flights of its DC-8 cargo plane brought emergency supplies from its base in Greensboro, NC.

The first delivery on October 7 brought more than 30 tons of relief, including food, blankets and solar lights, to Yerevan. Samaritan's Purse set up its own Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) by working with local evangelical church partners to deliver this relief. According to its press release, it promised hot meals, and necessities such as personal hygiene kits, diapers, cleaning supplies, bed linens and blankets.

Moreover, Samaritan's Purse medical teams began working in local hospitals to help burn victims from a gas station explosion near Stepanakert during the exodus from Artsakh. Two burn specialty teams provided surgical care to these victims, including wound care, skin grafts, and post-operative physical therapy, as well as prayer.

"The depth and extent of these [wounds from the explosion] are probably some of the worst I've seen in my 27 years of experience working in burn treatment. The amount of suffering here is beyond human comprehension," said Joany McDougall, a nurse on Samaritan's DART, in an October 11 article.

By October 11, Samaritan's Purse had 28 people on the ground in Armenia, including the burn specialty teams. A second flight left North Carolina on October 12 with 23 tons of emergency supplies.

Rick Emenaker of Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) was on vacation with his Armenian-American wife during the Azerbaijani invasion of Artsakh in September 2023. Samaritan's Purse asked whether he could help with its relief efforts and MAF gave Emenaker permission to stay after his vacation in October and early November to assist in these efforts.

He said, "I did do some of the distribution and helped with it, but my main role was actually to get the two DC-8 airplanes in — to get landing permission for them. I know all of the people in civil aviation, up to the director." He also went out on the ramp on the aviation side, and help with the unloading and getting the items through customs.

Emenaker added, "I was in reality a point of contact for a lot of people because I know a lot of people. That enabled them to do their work a lot easier." Emenaker explained that he understands Armenian fairly well as well as Russian, because he and his wife lived in Russia for eight years. He said he knows a lot of people in Armenia, primarily within the Evangelical community, as well as outside it, because he has been there 8 or 9 times in the last few years for various reasons.

He found that the refugees he spoke with seemed not to want to try to return to Artsakh again. Emenaker related, "The interesting thing for me was that many of them said, [when asked], do you want to go back to

Artsakh, no, we are done. We are finished. Let's start life afresh and move forward."

He declared, "Without going into a whole lot, I think there is such an opportunity here, if the diaspora and many others could realize that this is actually an opportunity for Armenia to regroup and become stronger. You have 120,000 people, many of them farmers who work the land, hard workers, and they have big families. Many of them have 6 or 7 kids." They are looking for work, and considering going to Russia, he said, but when talking to some of them, "they said: If we had a piece of land to work and grow we would do it. We don't want to leave, but what choice [do we have]?"

Emenaker stressed, "Artsakh is gone. We don't like it but we have to face reality at the moment. It doesn't mean that in 20-30 years it can't be back. I mean, things do change, but that is all philosophical. I just think there is an opportunity for Armenia now. If you want to keep the land, if you really want to make Armenia prosper, there is an opportunity for that to happen." Here, the diaspora could play an important role, he said.

Samaritan's Purse brought emergency supplies to Armenia after the 2020 war as well, according to its own press releases. It airlifted over 22 tons, including coats, boots, thermals, gloves, socks and beanies, while distributing winter kits, blankets and food to over 8,000 displaced families. Mobile medical teams provided care to more than 500 patients. Emenaker was in Armenia from the start of the war, and afterwards participated in the 2020 relief efforts, through MAF, in the same way as in 2023. He assisted Samaritan's Purse in getting aircraft permissions for landing, helped with customs to get donated items released, and then helped to work with local churches for distribution of goods.

He recalled, "That was hard. That was winter when that happened when a lot of people poured in. The difference is, back then they all thought they were going back, and many of them did, the majority. This time they know they are not."

Emenaker stated that he had heard that Samaritan's Purse would conclude its current program of assistance on November 22. Meanwhile, he has his own plans connected with Armenia. He said, "We'll be back. In fact, my wife and I plan to climb Ararat next year with some friends."

First Armenian Presbyterian Church Honors Elizabeth Adanalian Shirinian on her 95th Birthday

A Remarkable Journey: From Fresno's Armenian Town to 77 Years of Faithful Service at FAPC



Elizabeth Adanalian Shirinian –the longest-tenured member of First Armenian Presbyterian Church—celebrated her 95th Birthday on November 10, 2023. Liz was born to Simon and Flora (Nalbandian) Adanalian in Fowler Sanitarium.

She grew up with brothers George, Simon, Junior, and Aram in Fresno's historic Armenian Town, first on L Street and later at 333 N Street near Monterey Street. Liz was educated at Emerson Elementary School, Longfellow Junior High School, and Fresno Technical High School, which she attended with friend Alma Kazanjian.

She also studied at then-Fresno State College. Liz remembered attending services at the Fulton Street Church and the kindness of early-day members Nishan and Araxie Terzian and John and Agavne Avakian. The Terzians and Avakians would take turns and drive the Adanalian children back home after Sunday services.

The Adanalian kids referred to Mrs. Terzian as "The Gum Lady" because she made sure Liz and her brothers were supplied with chewing gum on the drive back to N Street. Liz also remembered Neva (Kaltakian) Tavlian picking up neighbor Karnig "Kay" Cloud at Cherry and Jensen Avenues, traveling into Downtown Fresno, and then picking up Liz for FAPC Sunday School. Liz's many other FAPC friends included Doris (Simonian) Thomas, Dorothea Simonian, and Wilma Giorgetti, daughter of founding Fidelis Women's Society President Grace Adams.

The Session received Liz into the membership of FAPC on April 18, 1946, the Reverend Arsham K. Yeramian officiating.

On May 14, 1955, Liz married U.S. Navy Veteran Harry Shirinian of Sanger. (Harry's nephew, Dr. Dennis Shamlian served as Ring Bearer!) The bridal couple made their first home in Reedley and Liz worked at the Tower District Branch of Security-Pacific Bank and later the Tuolumne Street Branch of Bank of America.

The Lord blessed Liz and Harry with son Randy on February 2, 1959, and the family settled into a beautiful home in the Sunnyside neighborhood of southeast Fresno. Liz remembered that the Shirinians lived "around the corner" from Alfred and Pearl (Najarian) Lion and that she and Pearl would often attend Fidelis Society meetings together.

Reflecting on 77 years of communicant membership, Liz vividly recalls her mother, Flora, "was at Church all the time, every Sunday - all the way to the end." Liz continues to faithfully read her Bible and says her favorite passage is Psalm 91.

On Monday Nov. 27, 2023, AMAA representative Harout Nercessian facilitated a zoom launch meeting between FAPC & Goris Church in Armenia with the participation of the two Ministers to the Unions (AEUNA and ECA), the two church pastors (Badveli Greg Haroutunian & Badveli Sarkis Ochinyan) and others appointed by the two parties. On the FAPC side, Luther and Tamar Sevajian were appointed to lead this relationship and the subsequent meetings. 



Next week, for example, a team of forty of our young adults will be leading the first of many two-day outreaches in highly populated refugee areas around Armenia. And from this, we'll be starting youth clubs, Alpha groups (a ten-week gathering of young adults interested in hearing more about faith in Christ), etc.

About a third of the coats that you helped us purchase will be distributed next week in the town of Masis and its surrounding villages. Thousands of refugees have settled there and are in immediate need of help. So, THANK YOU for helping us help them. In Loving Memory: FAPC Mourns the Passing of Two Cherished Members, Helen Jean Baboian and Horsrof Davidian Remembering Lives Well-Lived: Honoring the Legacies of a Devoted Sunday School Teacher and a WWII Navy Veteran at First Armenian Presbyterian Church



Helen Jean (Mourad) Baboian – Primary Grade Sunday School Teacher to the FAPC Boomer Generation – passed away on October 30, 2023, her 101st Birthday. A native of Chicago, Helen worked for the Bell Telephone Company in the Midwest.

Her father, Hachadur K. Mourad was a charter member of the Armenian Congregational Church in the Windy City. On October 15, 1952, Helen married Chester C. Baboian at FAPC. Chester was an administrator with the then-U.S. Post Office, a longtime Trustee of the Church, and the youngest member of the Building Committee that moved the FAPC Campus from Fulton and Santa Clara Streets to First Street and Huntington Boulevard in 1942.

Helen was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Chester; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. H.K. Mourad; her brother Richard; and her brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Jasper and Agnes Moomjian. She is survived by her daughters, Joyce Baboian of Fresno and Candy Vera of Oklahoma, and many dear relations in the Mourad, Baboian, and Moomjian Families.




