Pastor's Message

10 Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say: "Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Messiah. For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down. 11 They triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death.

The "unveiling," Revelation, the Apocalypse ... the last book of the New Testament, the last book of the Bible is filled with mystery, imagery, bizarre sights and sounds. No wonder God's people regard it from two extremes: 1) from a distance, only sampling various verses divorced from their context or 2) with passionate obsession, trying desperately to see every recorded detail in the current events of our present day.

In a year that promises to be filled with dramatic partisanship, incivility and conflict, we are

diving into one of the most controversial portions of Scripture to humbly seek the mind of Christ to see the past, the present and the future from what God has revealed in His Word. We are promised "blessing" as we read it out loud, as we listen to it and as we take it to heart. (1:3)

I'm so excited to invite you to join in our Sunday Morning Study (SMS) each week @ 9 a.m. in the Fireside Room. The enthusiasm and hunger to study God's Word together is so stimulating! One person described it as like throwing gasoline on a fire. We're taking more time to discuss and reflect on the passages than we can take in a morning sermon and it's wonderful to have such energetic participation!

Each one of us and all of us as a congregation need to be strengthened by His Word. We want to be like those described in Revelation 12:11 who triumph day by day over the evil one "by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony." Our confidence in our relationship with God lays solely with "the Lamb who was slain." He secures our forgiveness and our salvation. Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior and we will praise Him with the people of God for all eternity!

First Armenian Presbyterian Church hosted a momentous beginning to the **21 Days of Prayer and Fasting** on January 8, 2024. The kickoff event, streamed live on YouTube, emphasized a call for unity among pastors and churches, igniting hearts and fostering a renewed sense of mission within the community. This unique initiative is sponsored by the Fresno-Clovis Pastor Clusters. Each night during the 21 days, a different church hosted and provided an opportunity for the community to experience the depth and diversity of congregations across Fresno and Clovis. The underlying theme of the initiative was Unity, recognizing that despite differences, we are One Church in Jesus Christ.



The nightly services, featured a blend of prayer and worship, creating a powerful atmosphere for collective spiritual growth. This event served as an excellent opportunity for the local community to come together in unity, lifting their voices in prayer for the region. This year the events were jam packed, and we had attendees from over 100+ local churches and ministries in attendance.

Attendees were led in worship by FAPC's worship team. The excitement and energy was powerfully palpable. At the end of the evening, worship leader Chris Shamlian expressed his awe at the event's enthusiastic turnout.

Dr. Zareh Darakjian December 1, 1950 to January 28, 2024

Dr. Zareh Darakjian – scientist, educator, linguist, musician, philosopher, child of God – passed away in Fresno on January 28, 2024 at the age of 73.

A native of Aleppo, Syria, Zareh received his early education at the Armenian Evangelical Bethel Kindergarten and Emmanuel Elementary School, secondary education at the Aleppo College for Boys, and then undergraduate education with honors at Haigazian University in Beirut, Lebanon.

In 1979, Zareh and his sister Vera immigrated to the United States. Zareh continued his education at California State University, Northridge and then earned Master of Science and Doctoral degrees in Theoretical Chemistry at the University of California, Davis.

He received the Clorox Award for Best Graduate Student at UC Davis and went on to serve as a Lecturer in the Ohio State University Department of Chemistry from 1992 to 1996. He then conducted research at Rice University in Houston and in Newark, Delaware.

Nicknamed "the Walking Encyclopedia," Zareh was the author of eight published articles in computational and chemical physics. After departing Delaware, Zareh devoted his remaining years to private education and tutoring, including nursing and medical students.

Humble and humorous, Zareh was fond of saying, "Never stop asking questions!" and "Science and God go together; you cannot separate them!" Zareh was preceded in death by his parents, Mesrob and Sophie Darakjian.

He is survived by his sister, Vera, and brother and sister-in-law, Dr. Vahe and Annie Darakjian, and their daughters Lori Harer and her husband Matt, and Gareen Darakjian, and granddaughter, Gracie Harer; and a host of dear cousins and their families worldwide -- Drs. Nazareth and Ani Darakjian; Drs. Hrayr and Nadia Darakjian; Arpy and Curtis Sahakian; Suzy Darakjian; Arda and Carl Clark; Aline Hoffman; Rubina Darakjian; Rafi Darakjian; Ara Darakjian; Shahe and Mary Darakjian; Houry and Michael Vitale; Gassia and Rafi Mouradian; Rev. Thomas Charles "Tom" Bulger

November 13, 1945 - February 3, 2024

Thomas "Tom" Charles Bulger, 78, of Milan, formerly of Fresno, CA, passed away on Saturday, Feb. 3, 2024, in Rock Island, Illinois.

Tom was born on Nov. 13, 1945, in Moline, IL, the son of Charles and Violette (Hallquist) Bulger, and brother to his younger sister, Mary. He graduated from Moline High School in 1963. Tom attended Black Hawk College where he met Carolynn Sims in Spanish class. They married on May 26, 1968, at Central Presbyterian Church, had two daughters, Bridget Kathleen and Brittany Jeanne, and cherished 55 wonderful years together.



In his early years, Tom worked as a paper boy, made ice cream at Whitey's, coded for International Harvester, and worked sales for Duffy Paper Company.

His desire to serve others moved him to return to college and enroll at the University of Iowa in 1971. He received a degree in Recreation Therapy. After he graduated college, in 1974, Tom and Carolynn moved to Fresno after Tom received a job offer from Fresno Community Hospital to work in its Alcohol Rehab Program, and continued to work for the hospital for over 20 years. Tom worked in the mental health field serving adults and children of Fresno for over 37 years.

Being of service was always a priority for Tom. He began volunteering at Central Presbyterian by teaching Sunday school, tutoring children, and being a youth group leader. While living in Fresno, Tom continued to volunteer his time by coaching his daughters' t-ball teams, feeding the homeless, organizing inner-city outreach missions, coaching and refereeing inner-city basketball leagues, tutoring children and holding multiple volunteer positions at World Impact and at First Armenian Presbyterian Church.

When Tom and Carolynn returned to the Quad Cities, Tom continued his life of service at Good Shepherd Church, Trinity Hospital, and Christian Care Rescue Mission. Tom was a truly selfless person who never met a stranger. To Carolynn's dismay at times, it was not unusual for him to give hitchhikers rides and give away his last dollar.

Committed to his faith, Tom attended Central Presbyterian in Rock Island, First Armenian Presbyterian Church in Fresno, and Good Shepherd (now Grace Presbyterian) in Rock Island.

Throughout his life, Tom experienced many physical challenges, but his faith in the Lord gave him the strength to go on. Tom's faith also gave him the privilege of being a helpful listener and counselor for family and friends.

Tom enjoyed playing, coaching, refereeing, and watching sports, especially the Chicago White Sox, Iowa Hawkeyes and Notre Dame. When he could no longer play sports he turned to walking, volunteering, feeding birds and squirrels and enjoying the spectacular sunsets off his balcony. A wonderful encourager, Tom spent lots of time calling family and friends.

Those left to cherish Tom's memory include his wife, Carolynn; daughter, Bridget Ginty and husband, Kevin; daughter, Brittany Becklin and husband, Matt; granddaughter, Jovie Becklin; sister, Mary Maze and husband, Gary; canine companion, Baxter; and many beloved cousins and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents and in-laws, Melvin and Mary Sims.

Part of the recovery from loss effort is achieved by discovering and completing the undelivered communications that accrue in relationships. Learning about appropriate action choices can lead to emotional healing.

Combining the above tool with spiritual discipline is key. Filling the void created by pain with God's word and promises can serve as a great intervention.

The Grief Care Group program offers a Christ-based curriculum that fosters a safe environment to process loss stories and offers tools to make healthy choices that lead to a path for healing, wholeness, and completion of interrupted relationships.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." - Mathew 5:4

Grief is a natural human reaction to emotional pain caused by a loss of someone or something significant to us. Although grief is mainly emotional, it also has physical, cognitive, behavioral, social, spiritual, and philosophical dimensions.

As fallen beings, we experience pain through various types of losses during our lifetime that produce grief. The most prevalent ones are:

- Death
- Divorce (or end of a relationship)
- Loss of Health
- Loss of Job
- Migration

Just as each relationship is unique, so are our feelings and grieving experiences. We express the range of emotions, depth, and severity of our pain according to our personalities and makeup very differently from each other. Hence, it is not helpful to compare our grief with someone else's.











